

## **Generative AI policy**

Unless stated otherwise, you may use generative AI programs (e.g., tools like Chat GPT) to help generate ideas and brainstorm. However, you should note that the material generated by these programs may be inaccurate, incomplete, or otherwise problematic. Beware that use may also stifle your own independent thinking and creativity. You may not submit any work generated by an AI program as your own. If you include material generated by an AI program, it should be cited like any other reference material (with due consideration for the quality of the reference, which may be poor). Any plagiarism or other form of cheating will be dealt with severely under relevant school policies.

## **Tech Code**

- Students should consult professor if they allow use electronic and communications equipment (tablet, laptops, mobile telephones, etc) in the classroom
- In case of hybrid classes, student must follow a specific tech code

## **Academic Code**

- In any written (or oral) project, credits for the ideas of other authors must be clearly granted. Should this not be the case, the text (or presentation) will indicate to the professor (or the audience) that the ideas presented are the original concepts of the writer (or presenter).
- Should no credit explicitly assigned to the authors inspiring the project, this will constitute improper expropriating of the work of others and will be rated as a serious fault.
